Rangitikei College officially opened its brand new synthetic multi turf on Friday; by unveiling the turf sign, which is surrounded by lifesize cutouts of local sports icons and pupils, representing the college's sporting codes.

The project was part one of a collaborative turf fundraising effort between Rangitikei College, Rangitikei District Council and Nga Tawa School and will be open to primary and secondary schools to use, as well as the general public.

Rangitikei College principal Tony Booker thanked the fundraising committee, led by Greg Carlyon, which raised \$500,000 for the project, which sees Rangitikei College students getting the same facilities as anywhere in NZ.

Mr Booker also thanked those who gave many voluntary hours towards the project; in particular, Shane Gribbon and the Rangitikei College Trust, which gave its biggest ever donation of \$200,000 towards the turf project. He also thanked council grounds manager Athol Sanson, college staffer Maree Marshall (for getting the turf up and running) and sign and graphic designer Emmanuel Yiannoutsos, as well as Marie Gurney and family for their contribution. He said the college will now get behind the Nga Tawa School hockey turf project.

Mayor Andy Watson said, "Wow, this multi turf is a window in front of the school and the greatest advert for getting students into the school."

The mayor said the turf is result of the tenacity of Greg Carlyon and his team and their commitment to a partnership with Nga Tawa. He said it also shows that the council is not just about rubbish and water, with its \$200,000 grant to this part of the project.

Greg Carlyon said, "The project took 17 months, after a battle with the weather and has taken the school courts from a 1960s example to a 2017 facility.'

Bulls Rose Show oldest in NZ



The 140th Bulls Rose and Flower Show is officially the oldest rose show in New Zealand, according to renowned NZ judge Peter Elliot.

Mr Elliot has a long time connection to the Bulls Rose and Flower Show, as it was founded in 1877 by his great great, grandparents, Thomas and Margaret McKenzie from Poynzfield, a large former country home, near Bulls, now demolished.

Some very historic trophies are awarded at the Bulls Rose Show with names that hark back to the history of the township and district, including a shield donated by the McKenzies, the RO Dalrymple perpetual trophy and the June Hocking perpetual salver.

Chris Bassett won Queen of the Show. Peter Elliot won Champion Vase of the show and best exhibit in the open section, as well as judging sections he was not entered in. He says the standard entries was very good and, considering the awful spring weather, there were some very nice blooms. He says he was pleased to be involved as it was such a special event – being its 140 year celebration.

He says he has been participating in the Bulls show since 1986, when he moved to live in Palmerston North. He has been growing and showing roses since 1977. He has judged roses all over the world - South Africa, Canada, France, Japan, USA and UK. "My hobby has taken me all around the world but roses give such great pleasure."

The cut flower, baking and floral art sections were also a feature of the 140th show.


Volunteer Support Officer, Colin Leighton from Whanganui_said it was great to see families takling an interest in what our firefighters do.

They are far less likely to talk to their sons about respectful relationships and respectful sexual relationships. It is those ongoing talks that strengthen behaviour," says Mr Tawera.

"People who don't think this is an important message may be part of the problem. We have seen in recent times high profile Hollywood producers in the spotlight for violent and abusive sexual behaviour towards women. It happens at all levels of society.'

Mr Tawera says men need to step outside the stereotyped thinking that reinforces negative behaviour. He says developing values and empathy gives men better relationships, happiness and

So the message is out there: we need to be talking with our sons and daughters to help them understand the value of respectful, non-violent relationships.

The White Ribbon lower North Island ride will visit 11 schools along the way, engaging with both primary and secondary students to encourage respectful relationships among young people. Twelve community market days, activities, meetings and events, organized by non-violence and other agencies which aim to strengthen families, are also on the itinerary.






